

# German Beer Purity Law of 1516

## Bayrisches Reinheitsgebot von 1516

All of our beers, including our non-alcoholic Weissbier, are brewed in strict accordance with the 'Bayrisches Reinheitsgebot', the 'German Purity Law', of 1516.



The most important element of this Law is the strict definition of what ingredients may be used in making beer. However, after its discovery as a fermentation agent, yeast was also added to the 'allowed' ingredients.

"We wish to emphasize that in future in all cities, markets and in the country, the only ingredients used for the brewing of beer must be Barley, Hops and Water"

On the left is the largest representation of this section of the German Purity Law in the world. This is located on the production building wall of our beer-maker, Tucher Brewery, in Nuremberg, Germany.
